# Euro area unemployment rate at 12.2%

EU27 at 11.0%

This News Release, published on 1 July 2013, has been revised, following the correction of an error in the loading of the French data. The French unemployment rate for May 2013 is revised upwards by 0.5 percentage points. This correction results in an upwards revision of 0.1 pp in the EA17 and EU27 unemployment rates, while the trend is not affected.

The **euro area**<sup>1</sup> (EA17) seasonally-adjusted<sup>2</sup> unemployment rate<sup>3</sup> was 12.2% in May 2013, up from 12.1% in April<sup>4</sup>. The **EU27**<sup>1</sup> unemployment rate was 11.0%, stable compared with the previous month<sup>4</sup>. In both zones, rates have risen markedly compared with May 2012, when they were 11.3% and 10.4% respectively. These figures are published by **Eurostat**, **the statistical office of the European Union**.


Eurostat estimates that 26.522 million men and women in the **EU27**, of whom 19.340 million were in the **euro area**, were unemployed in May 2013. Compared with April 2013, the number of persons unemployed increased by 15 000 in the **EU27** and by 67 000 in the **euro area**. Compared with May 2012, unemployment rose by 1.438 million in the **EU27** and by 1.459 million in the **euro area**.

## **Member States**

Among the Member States, the lowest unemployment rates were recorded in **Austria** (4.7%), **Germany** (5.3%) and **Luxembourg** (5.7%), and the highest in **Spain** (26.9%) and **Greece** (26.8% in March 2013).

Compared with a year ago, the unemployment rate increased in seventeen Member States and fell in ten. The highest increases were registered in **Cyprus** (11.4% to 16.3%), **Greece** (22.2% to 26.8% between March 2012 and March 2013) and **Slovenia** (8.6% to 11.2%). The largest decreases were observed in **Latvia** (15.5% to 12.4% between the first quarters of 2012 and 2013), **Estonia** (10.0% to 8.3% between April 2012 and April 2013) and **Lithuania** (13.3% to 11.7%).

In May 2013, the unemployment rate in the **United States** was 7.6%, up from 7.5% in the previous month and down from 8.2% in May 2012.



#### Youth unemployment

In May 2013, 5.525 million young persons (under 25) were unemployed in the **EU27**, of whom 3.555 million were in the **euro area**. Compared with May 2012, youth unemployment decreased by 53 000 in the **EU27** and increased by 84 000 in the **euro area**. In May 2013, the youth unemployment rate was 23.1% in the **EU27** and 23.9% in the **euro area**, compared with 22.8% and 23.0% respectively in May 2012. In May 2013, the lowest rates were observed in **Germany** (7.6%), **Austria** (8.7%) and the **Netherlands** (10.6%), and the highest in **Greece** (59.2% in March 2013), **Spain** (56.5%) and **Portugal** (42.1%).

- 1. The euro area (EA17) consists of Belgium, Germany, Estonia, Ireland, Greece, Spain, France, Italy, Cyprus, Luxembourg, Malta, the Netherlands, Austria, Portugal, Slovenia, Slovakia and Finland.
  - Up to 30 June 2013, the European Union (EU27) included Belgium (BE), Bulgaria (BG), the Czech Republic (CZ), Denmark (DK), Germany (DE), Estonia (EE), Ireland (IE), Greece (EL), Spain (ES), France (FR), Italy (IT), Cyprus (CY), Latvia (LV), Lithuania (LT), Luxembourg (LU), Hungary (HU), Malta (MT), the Netherlands (NL), Austria (AT), Poland (PL), Portugal (PT), Romania (RO), Slovenia (SI), Slovakia (SK), Finland (FI), Sweden (SE) and the United Kingdom (UK). From 1 July 2013 the European Union (EU28) also includes Croatia (HR).
  - As part of Eurostat's guidelines for the dissemination of data when the EU is enlarged, the aggregate data series commented on in this News Release refer to the official composition of the EU in the most recent month for which data is available. Thus News Releases with data for months up to June 2013 will comment on EU27 series, while Releases with data for July 2013 onwards will comment on EU28 series.

- 3. Eurostat produces harmonised unemployment rates for individual EU Member States, the euro area and the EU. These unemployment rates are based on the definition recommended by the International Labour Organisation (ILO). The measurement is based on a harmonised source, the European Union Labour Force Survey (LFS). Based on the ILO definition, Eurostat defines unemployed persons as persons aged 15 to 74 who:
  - are without work:
  - are available to start work within the next two weeks;
  - and have actively sought employment at some time during the previous four weeks.

The *unemployment rate* is the number of people unemployed as a percentage of the labour force. The *labour force* is the total number of people employed plus unemployed. In this news release unemployment rates are based on employment and unemployment data covering persons aged 15 to 74.

- 4. The data in this News Release are normally subject to small revisions, caused by the updates to the seasonally adjusted series whenever new monthly data are added. Larger revisions can occur when the most recent LFS data are included in the calculation process. Compared with the rates published in News Release 82/2013 of 31 May 2013, the April 2013 unemployment rate has been revised from 12.2% to 12.1% for the EA17 and remains unchanged at 11.0% for the EU27. Among Member States, the rate for the most recent month available has been revised by between 0.2 and 0.4 percentage points for Greece, France, Cyprus, Malta and Slovakia. The rate has been revised upwards by 0.5 pp for Bulgaria and by 0.9 pp for Slovenia.
- Latvia: quarterly data for all series.
   Cyprus, Romania, Slovenia and Croatia: quarterly data for youth unemployment.
- 6. For Germany, Austria, Finland and Iceland the trend component is used instead of the more volatile seasonally adjusted data.


