## Euro area unemployment rate at 12.1%

EU28 at 11.0%

The **euro area**<sup>1</sup> (EA17) seasonally-adjusted<sup>2</sup> unemployment rate<sup>3</sup> was 12.1% in July 2013, stable compared with June<sup>4</sup>. The **EU28**<sup>1</sup> unemployment rate was 11.0%, also stable compared with June<sup>4</sup>. In both zones, rates have risen compared with July 2012, when they were 11.5% and 10.5% respectively. These figures are published by **Eurostat, the statistical office of the European Union**.


Eurostat estimates that 26.654 million men and women in the **EU28**, of whom 19.231 million were in the **euro area**, were unemployed in July 2013. Compared with June 2013, the number of persons unemployed decreased by 33 000 in the **EU28** and by 15 000 in the **euro area**. Compared with July 2012, unemployment rose by 995 000 in the **EU28** and by 1.008 million in the **euro area**.

## **Member States**

Among the Member States, the lowest unemployment rates were recorded in **Austria** (4.8%), **Germany** (5.3%) and **Luxembourg** (5.7%), and the highest in **Greece** (27.6% in May 2013) and **Spain** (26.3%).

Compared with a year ago, the unemployment rate increased in seventeen Member States and fell in eleven. The highest increases were registered in **Cyprus** (12.2% to 17.3%), **Greece** (23.8% to 27.6% between May 2012 and May 2013), **Slovenia** (9.3% to 11.2%) and the **Netherlands** (5.3% to 7.0%). The largest decreases were observed in **Latvia** (15.7% to 11.5% between the second quarters of 2012 and 2013) and **Estonia** (10.1% to 7.9% between June 2012 and June 2013).

In July 2013, the unemployment rate in the **United States** was 7.4%, down from 7.6% in June and from 8.3% in July 2012.



## Youth unemployment

In July 2013, 5.560 million young persons (under 25) were unemployed in the **EU28**, of whom 3.500 million were in the **euro area**. Compared with July 2012, youth unemployment decreased by 53 000 in the **EU28** and by 16 000 in the **euro area**. In July 2013, the youth unemployment rate<sup>5</sup> was 23.4% in the **EU28** and 24.0% in the **euro area**, compared with 22.9% and 23.3% respectively in July 2012. In July 2013, the lowest rates were observed in **Germany** (7.7%), **Austria** (9.2%) and **Malta** (10.6%), and the highest in **Greece** (62.9% in May 2013), **Spain** (56.1%) and **Croatia** (55.4% in the second quarter of 2013).

1. The euro area (EA17) consists of Belgium, Germany, Estonia, Ireland, Greece, Spain, France, Italy, Cyprus, Luxembourg, Malta, the Netherlands, Austria, Portugal, Slovenia, Slovakia and Finland.

The EU27 includes Belgium (BE), Bulgaria (BG), the Czech Republic (CZ), Denmark (DK), Germany (DE), Estonia (EE), Ireland (IE), Greece (EL), Spain (ES), France (FR), Italy (IT), Cyprus (CY), Latvia (LV), Lithuania (LT), Luxembourg (LU), Hungary (HU), Malta (MT), the Netherlands (NL), Austria (AT), Poland (PL), Portugal (PT), Romania (RO), Slovenia (SI), Slovakia (SK), Finland (FI), Sweden (SE) and the United Kingdom (UK). From 1 July 2013 the European Union (EU28) also includes Croatia (HR).

As part of Eurostat's guidelines for the dissemination of data when the EU is enlarged, the aggregate data series commented on in this News Release refer to the official composition of the EU in the most recent month for which data is available. Thus News Releases with data for months up to June 2013 commented on EU27 series, while Releases with data for July 2013 onwards comment on EU28 series.

- 3. Eurostat produces harmonised unemployment rates for individual EU Member States, the euro area and the EU. These unemployment rates are based on the definition recommended by the International Labour Organisation (ILO). The measurement is based on a harmonised source, the European Union Labour Force Survey (LFS). Based on the ILO definition, Eurostat defines unemployed persons as persons aged 15 to 74 who:
  - are without work:
  - are available to start work within the next two weeks;
  - and have actively sought employment at some time during the previous four weeks.

The *unemployment rate* is the number of people unemployed as a percentage of the labour force. The *labour force* is the total number of people employed plus unemployed. In this news release unemployment rates are based on employment and unemployment data covering persons aged 15 to 74.

- 4. The data in this News Release are normally subject to small revisions, caused by the updates to the seasonally adjusted series whenever new monthly data are added. Larger revisions can occur when the most recent LFS data are included in the calculation process. Compared with the rates published in News Release 118/2013 of 31 July 2013, the June 2013 unemployment rates remain unchanged at 12.1% for the EA17 and at 11.0% for the EU28. Among Member States, the rate has been revised by between 0.2 and 0.4 percentage points for Ireland, Cyprus and Lithuania. The rate has been revised downwards by 0.7 percentage points for Portugal.
- 5. The *youth unemployment rate* is the number of people aged 15 to 24 unemployed as a percentage of the labour force of the same age. Therefore, the youth unemployment rate should not be interpreted as the share of jobless people in the overall youth population. 
